Ach! An enemy plane! With paratroopers!



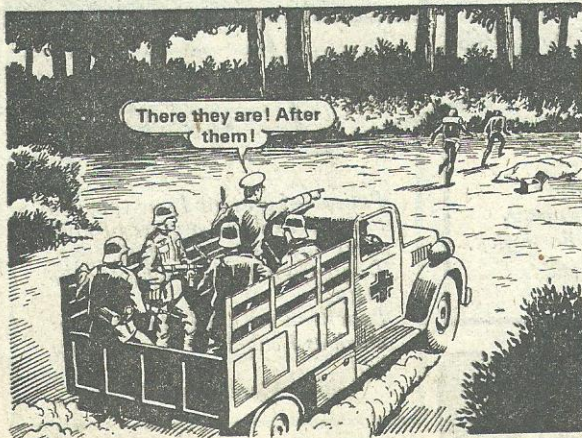
Ja, ja! There were at least three parachutes! I saw them with my own eyes, dropping on to the common land about two kilometres away.

Get in the truck. We can deal with three!

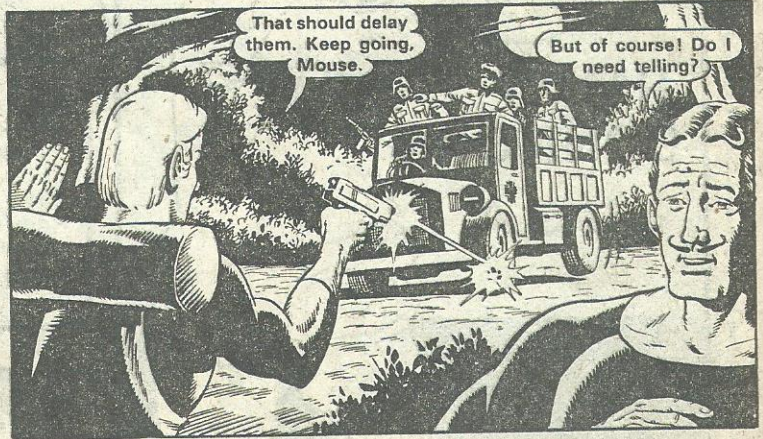


Hurry! We cannot spend all night here.

Oui, oui, but we must hide the evidence of our arrival, no?

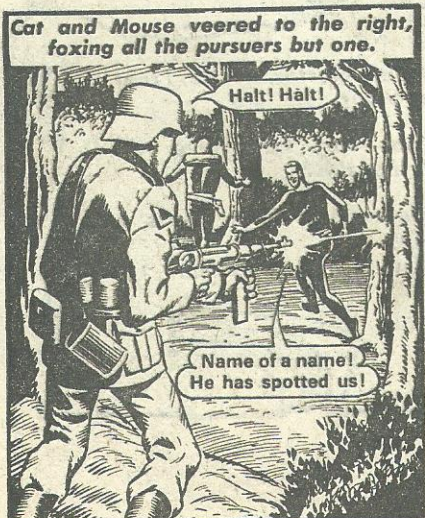


There they are! After them!
