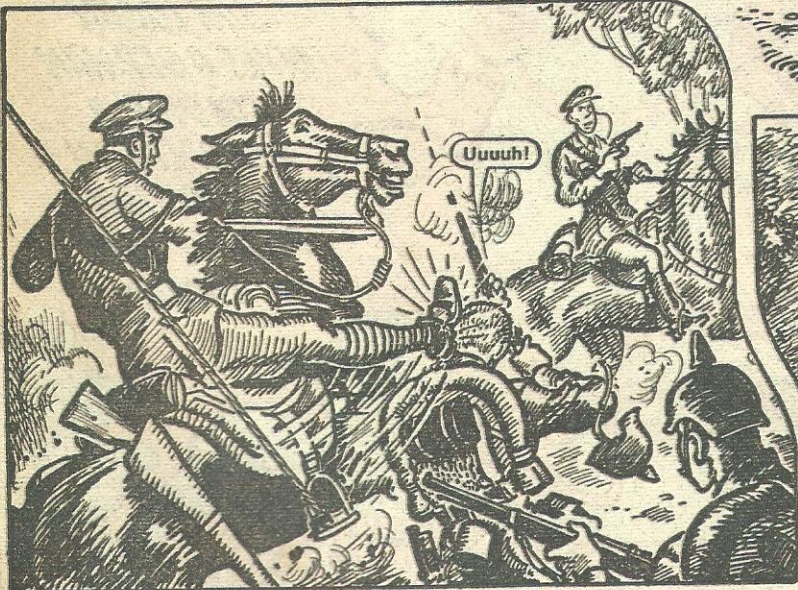


LOGAN'S BOOT SAVES STUBBINS' LIFE!
