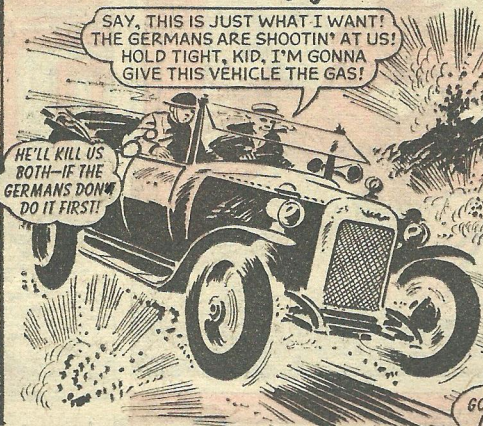

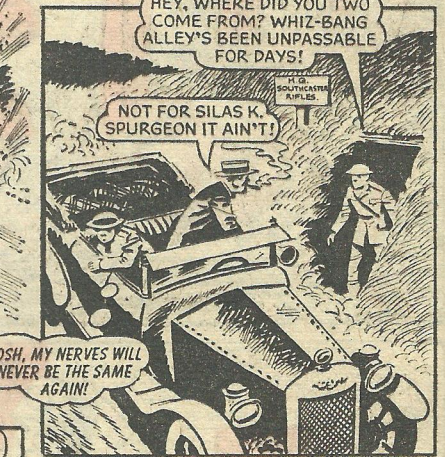
WHIZ-BANG ALLEY UNDER ENEMY OBSERVATION FOR FIVE MILES. YOU ARE WARNED.

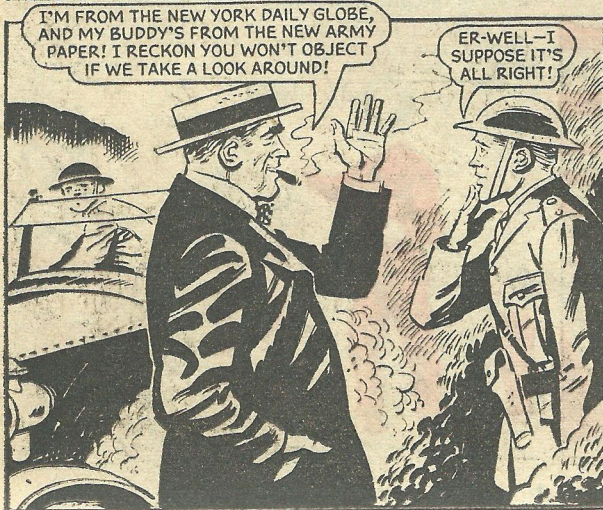
